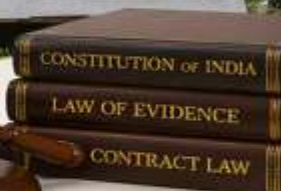

An Appeal to Parents and Guardians

- Parents and guardians are kindly requested to carefully read through the prospectus before admitting their wards to the college.
- It is requested that parents and guardians make it a point to meet with the class teacher or principal at least twice a year to receive updates on the progress of their wards.
- Bringing mobile phones onto the campus is strictly prohibited as per university norms. Any student found with a mobile phone will have it confiscated, and strict action will be taken against them. Therefore, parents are urged not to provide mobile phones to their wards.
- Examinations for all classes are either term-end or semester-based. Parents are requested to ensure the regularity and compliance of their wards in internal examinations or evaluations.
- Parents are encouraged to monitor the progress of their wards during terminal and preliminary examinations conducted by the college.
- It is important to note that students of this institute are not allowed to simultaneously register for a law degree program with any other graduate, postgraduate, or certificate course offered by the same or any other university. However, exceptions are made for short-period part-time certificate courses in language, computer science, computer applications, or any add-on part-time courses related to law, provided the timings do not conflict with the college's schedule for law courses.

COURSE DETAILS: 5-Year B.A., LL.B. Degree

The B.A. LL.B. program is a 10-semester full-time Programme offered by the College affiliated to the University of Mumbai. It is structured as follows:

1. Duration: The program spans over 10 semesters.

2. Pre-Law Course (First 2 Years): This phase comprises the initial 4 semesters, focusing on foundational social science subjects such as Economics, Political Science, History, English, and Legal Language.

3. Law Course (Next 3 Years): Following the pre-law phase, the subsequent three years align with the curriculum of a standard three-year law course.

4. Optional Subjects: In the 8th and 10th semesters, students have the opportunity to select optional subjects in addition to some compulsory ones.

Practical Training: Practical training papers are mandatory for all students throughout the program.

5. Degrees Awarded:

- Bachelor of Arts in Legal Sciences (B.A.): Awarded upon successful completion of the 3rd year.
- LL.B. (Bachelor of Laws): Awarded upon completion of the 5th year.

6. Advantages of B.A., LLB. Degree: Obtaining the B.A., LLB. degree after 3 years allows students to officially graduate and pursue further postgraduate courses or apply for jobs and various entrance exams.

7. College Timing:

- 1st and 2nd year - 09:00AM to 02.00PM
- 3rd year onwards- 08.00AM-01.00PM



COURSE DETAILS: 3-Year LL.B. Degree

The 3-Year LL.B. degree program is tailored for graduates seeking a comprehensive legal education. Over the course of three years, students delve deeply into the study of law, equipping themselves with the knowledge and skills necessary for a career in the legal profession.

Eligibility and Certification:

Upon successful completion of the program, students are conferred with the LL.B. degree. This certification renders them eligible to practice as advocates, in accordance with the regulations stipulated by the Bar Council of India.

Curriculum Structure:

The curriculum is structured to provide a balanced blend of foundational legal principles and specialized areas of law. In the 4th and 6th semesters, students are afforded the opportunity to choose elective subjects alongside mandatory ones, tailoring their academic experience to suit their interests and career goals.

Practical Training:

Integral to the program are practical training papers, which are compulsory for all students. These components aim to provide hands-on experience and practical insights into legal practice, thereby augmenting theoretical knowledge with real-world application.

College Timing:

Classes are scheduled from: - 8:00 AM to 12:30 NOON





Admission Requirements for Five-Year Programme

- 1. Eligibility Criteria:-** Prospective candidates are required to appear for the Common Entrance Test (CET) Examination.
- 2. Educational Qualification:-** Applicants must have successfully completed the Higher Secondary Certificate (H.S.C) examination, equivalent to 10+2, conducted by the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education. Alternatively, candidates with qualifications recognized as equivalent by the University of Mumbai are also eligible.
- 3. Minimum Marks Requirement:-** A minimum of 45% marks in the H.S.C examination is mandatory for eligibility.
- 4. Reservation Policy:-** The prescribed percentage for minimum marks may be relaxed for candidates belonging to reserved categories, as determined by the authorities.

Admission Requirements for Three-Year Programme

The primary requirement for admission to the Three-Year Law Course is the appearance in the Common Entrance Test (CET) Examination.

A candidate who has successfully completed the Bachelor's Degree Examination from Mumbai University, in any faculty, with a minimum of 45% marks or an equivalent degree from any other University recognized as such by Mumbai University, with the minimum prescribed marks, is eligible for admission to the First Year L.L.B. The aforementioned percentage may be subject to relaxation as per the guidelines set forth by the authorities, particularly for candidates belonging to reserved categories.

CET Examination

The CET Examination for the 3-year LL. B course and the 5-year B.A., LL. B course is conducted by State Common Entrance Test Cell, Government of Maharashtra on the specified dates. The details are published on the official site of CET Cell from time to time and students are required to follow the said instruction and schedule published by the State Common Entrance Test Cell.





ADMISSION PROCEDURE

Admission is purely on merit and is subject to availability of seats as per the directions issued by University of Mumbai and Government of Maharashtra from time to time. A transparent admission procedure is followed strictly based on the standard norms. Any modification in admission guidelines will be notified on the college notice board at the time of admission. After the result of CET examination is declared, the State Common Entrance Test Cell publishes merit list of the students. The students are required to give options of the Law Colleges desired by them for admission in preferential order. For getting admission in Bhagubai Changu Thakur College of Law, the students must give this college, first preference while submitting online option form.

The CET cell makes allotment of college to the students and the students are required to secure the admission in college allotted to them within the time stipulated by the CET Cell. If the desired college is not allotted in the cap round, the students can wait for subsequent round for allotment of college. In case the desired college is not allotted in any of the Cap Round, then the admission in desired college can be secured in last round i.e. institutional round (vacant seats after cap round + Institution quota seats), however admission in institutional round is also subject to availability of seats and purely on merit. At the time of submitting online admission form with the State CET, the students submit various details viz. marks secured in various examinations including qualifying examination, Caste Reservation, Linguistic Minority, Religious Minority, etc.

The merit list is prepared by State CET on the basis CET score and the other updates submitted by the students at the time of filling up the online form and allotment of the college is made on the basis of said updates and consequent merit list. The said details are verified at the time of admitting the student in college and therefore it is the responsibility of the students to substantiate all the claims made by him at the time of submitting his details with State CET Cell.

SUBMISSION OF DOCUMENTS

At the time of taking admission all the necessary documents must be submitted before the College Authorities. The College reserves its right to deny admission, if it is found that the details submitted by the student with State CET Cell are contrary to actual record. The students are also specifically informed that after admission of the students in college, his documents are verified by the Admission Regulating Authority i.e. ARA (Directorate of Higher Education, Maharashtra State, Pune) and the provisional admission given by the College is confirmed only after approval of ARA. If the claim made by the student before State CET (As shown in merit list) in respect of caste, reservation, religious or linguistic minority is found to be not supported by legitimate documents, then ARA would not confirm the admission and such admission is liable to be cancelled.

It is further brought to the notice of the student, that the college authorities shall not be responsible in any manner, if the admission of a student is cancelled due to non-approval by Admission Regulating Authority on account of falsity in claim of the student.

EXAMINATION STANDARDS

Examination and Evaluation Guidelines

B.A., LL. B. (5 Years) & LL.B. (3 Years)

A candidate shall be declared "Passed" in the subjects/papers or Practical Training (if any), if he/she has secured a minimum of **40%** of the total marks in the examination conducted by the University of Mumbai for the respective semester.

Candidates shall also be entitled to the benefit of allowable grace marks as per university regulations.

For the 5-year BA.LLB course, the result of the 9th and 10th semester shall not be declared unless the candidate has passed in all the papers up to 9th semester.

For the 3-year LLB course, the result of the 5th and 6th semester shall not be declared unless the candidate has passed in all the papers up to 5th semester.

For the 3-year LL.B. course, the results of the 4th or 6th semesters shall not be declared unless the candidate has passed all the papers of the 2nd and 4th semesters respectively.

Practical Training Examination

Except for the first two years of the five-year Law Course, there shall be a practical training examination for each year of both courses. The pattern and syllabus of the examination shall be as prescribed by Mumbai University, and the mode and manner of conducting the practical training examination, i.e., written examination, viva voce, writing journal, etc., shall be notified in detail on the notice board of the College along with the distribution of marks under various heads.

The practical training examination of the relevant year is conducted before the regular examination of that year. The candidate is required to secure at least 40% marks in the Practical Training Examination.

Credit Based Evaluation System

Scheme of Examination for Undergraduate 3 Years LL.B. and 5 Years B.A., LL.B. Programme

The performance of the learners shall be evaluated into two components. The learner's performance shall be assessed by Internal Assessment, accounting for 40% of the total marks in the first component, and by conducting the Semester End Examinations, accounting for 75% of the total marks in the second component.

For the Semesters I to IV of the 5 years B.L.S., LL.B. programme, the assessment of 'Part A'. Internal Assessment and Part B i.e. Semester End Examination shall be processed by the Colleges/Institutions of their learners on behalf of the University and declare their results as per the procedure laid down by the University. The Colleges/Institutions shall accordingly issue the grade cards to them after conversion of marks into the grades as per the procedure mentioned in this manual. The format of the grade card is given here in below to maintain the uniformity across the all colleges for the examinations conducted by the colleges on behalf of the University.



SUBJECTS & SYLLABUS

The syllabus for LL.B. courses is prescribed by the University of Mumbai and may be subject to periodic revisions or modifications. Detailed information regarding the syllabus and recommended textbooks can be found on the University's official website. Additionally, these details are accessible on our college website, "bctcollegeoflaw.net," as well as on the relevant university portal. It is important to note that the University of Mumbai reserves the right to make necessary adjustments to the syllabus and examination structure; thus, it is essential for students to stay updated on any changes.

During the final two years of the Law Course, both in the three-year and five-year programs, students have the privilege to select optional subjects according to their preferences. The University has prescribed the syllabi and provided recommended reference materials for thorough understanding and preparation.

While there may be numerous textbooks and pre-prepared answers available for questions frequently asked in University examinations, relying solely on these resources may not offer a comprehensive grasp of the subject matter. Shortcut methods of study might not elucidate various legal concepts effectively. Therefore, to excel in legal education, it is imperative to consult the reference books prescribed by the University of Mumbai.

Examinations are conducted under the strict control and supervision of the University of Mumbai, with each subject examination carrying a weightage of 100 marks.

MODE OF REFUND

Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates

A reference is made to the Ordinance concerning the Refund of fees via this office Circular No. UG/257 of 2005 dated 1st July 2005. The principals of the affiliated colleges and the Heads/Directors of the recognized Institutions concerned are hereby informed that the proposal submitted by the committee for the amendment of 0.2859 relating to the refund of Tuition Fees/Development and all other fees after cancellation of admission for the Undergraduate Courses has been accepted by the Academic Council at its meeting held on 13th June 2008, vide Item No. 7.6. Subsequently, it was approved by the Management Council at its meeting held on 23rd July 2008, vide Item No. 6.

In accordance therewith, exercising the powers conferred upon the Management Council under Section 54 (1) of the Maharashtra Universities Act, 1994, it has amended Ordinance 2859 relating to the refund of fees to read as under:

4.1. Refund of Fees: The candidates who have taken admission in undergraduate courses in government colleges, government-aided, and unaided courses conducted by affiliated colleges and recognized institutions may request a refund of fees after applying in writing for cancellation of their admission to the course.

The refund of fees, as applicable, shall be made on or before the 30th day after the date of cancellation. Thereafter, the percentage of the fee for the course shall be refunded to the candidate after deducting charges as follows:

PERIOD AND PERCENTAGE OF DEDUCTION CHARGES	Deduction Charges
Prior to commencement of academic term and instruction of the Course	Rs. 500/- Lumpsum
Up to 20 days after commencement of the academic term of the course	20% of the total amount of fees
From 21st day up to 50 days after commencement of the academic term of the course	30% of the total amount of fees
From 51st day up to 80 days after commencement of academic term of the course or September 1st, whichever is earlier	50% of the total amount of fees
81st day upto 90 days	60% of the total amount of fees
After 91st day	100% of the total amount of fees



4.1. Note: The total amount considered for the refund of fees from the commencement of the academic term of the courses includes the following:

1. All the fee items chargeable for one year as per relevant University Circular for different Faculties (excluding the courses for which the total amount is fixed by other competent authorities).
2. The Fee charged towards group Insurance and all fee components to be paid as university share (including Vice-chancellor fund, University fee for sports and cultural activities, E-charge, disaster management fund, exam, fee, and Enrolment fee are non-refundable if payment is made by the college prior to the date of cancellation.
3. Fee collected for Identity card and Library card, admission form and prospectus, enrolment, and any other course-specific fee are not refundable after the commencement of the academic term.
4. All refundable deposits (Caution Money and Library etc.) shall be fully refunded at the time of cancellation.

Fees shall be refunded by all HEIs to an eligible student within fifteen days from the date of receiving a written application from him/her in this regard.

ATTENDANCE

Refund of Fees and Non-Retention of Original Certificates

- Attendance at all lectures/ practical/ tutorials/ tests/ assignments/ examinations is compulsory
- for all subjects. A student, who is not regular in attendance or fails to carry out his/her work to the satisfaction of the principal, is liable to cancellation of his/her terms.
- The student who does not have the minimum required attendance of 75% of actual lectures/practical/tutorials/tests/assignments conducted in each term or do not show satisfactory progress in terminal/preliminary examinations will not be sent for College/University examinations.
 - Periodical tests/seminars are compulsory for the students of all classes.
 - A student who remains absent for the periodical test/examination due to his/her illness shall be
 - required to submit the medical certificate, along with the application endorsed by parent
 - A student who remains absent for three consecutive days is required to submit a leave application duly signed by his/her parent/guardian.
 - Students who are not permitted for the University Examination will not be re-admitted to the college.



- The candidate must reach the examination hall 30 minutes before the exam starts. Also, no candidate shall be admitted to the examination hall if he reaches 30 minutes after the exam starts.
- No candidate shall be permitted to leave the examination hall for the first 30 minutes after the question paper has been distributed.
- The candidate is required to fill in the correct particulars on the first page of the answer book or wait for the correct instructions from the supervisor in the class to avoid any mistake with respect to the seat no., subject code, program name, date, subject name and so on.
- The candidate must either use blue or black ink pen to write the answers on the answer book. It is advised not to waste the pages and to write on both sides of the answer book.
- No candidate is allowed to write anything on the question paper. Any rough work to be done must be written on the last page of the answer book itself.
- No exchange of any written material, stencils, mathematical instruments or stationery is allowed during the examination.
- No candidate is allowed to leave the seat on any account except with the permission of the supervisor. Also, the candidate is not allowed to leave the examination hall during the last 10 minutes of the examination.
- A candidate is liable for the disciplinary action for using any unfair means during the examination. Unfair Means includes; keeping or carrying any book/ notes/ any other written material, communicating or speaking with another candidate, carrying or keeping any electronic gadgets like mobiles, smart watches, ear phones, etc.
- Also, a disciplinary action may be taken if a candidate disobeys the instructions issued by the supervisors and misbehaves or is rude towards them during examination.

Any use of unfair means during the examination will make the candidate liable for severe penalties as per the rules and regulations.



Behavior And Conduct

- Students are prohibited from doing anything inside or outside the college that will interfere with college administration or affect its public image. No outside influence, political or otherwise, should be brought into the college, directly or indirectly.
- Courtesy and respect must be the key aspects of students' behavior. Disrespect and disobedience may result in disciplinary action, including suspension or even expulsion.
- When the teacher enters the classrooms, students must rise and remain standing until they are directed to sit down. When the attendance roll is called, each student must rise and give their presentee.
- Students are expected to greet all visitors and members of the staff with respect. They should always remember that the college is judged by their conduct. Any major breach of discipline and courtesy, as well as disrespect for the members of the college staff, will be treated as serious, and responsible students for such misbehavior will be summarily dismissed.
- Scribbling on the walls and desks etc. should be avoided. If any student is found scribbling on the walls or desks, disciplinary action shall be taken against him/her.
- All students are responsible to the college authorities for their behavior both in and outside the college, both individually and collectively. Any reported or observed objectionable conduct outside the college on the part of the students shall render them liable for disciplinary action.
- Congregating on the road in front of the college or at the entrance of the college creates a bad impression on passersby and therefore, is to be avoided.
- Students are not expected to sit on the steps of the staircase or on the steps of the portico of the college.
- Students have to park their vehicles at the parking shed only. Movement of vehicles in the college campus shall be at a moderate speed only.
- Throwing about waste paper, defacing the walls, and committing nuisance on the college grounds are punishable offenses.
- Students must not join any club or society or make any engagement that would interfere with the academic schedule without the prior permission of the principal.
- Students are not allowed to play in any team against the official team of the college.
- Students must not organize or attend any meeting within the college or collect money for any purpose from students and outsiders or circulate among the students any notice or petition of any kind or paste it on the college notice board without the written permission of the principal.



- The college is not responsible for goods, valuables, or money lost in college premises. It is advisable not to bring valuables to the college.
- No books (other than textbooks, reference books, or library books), magazines, etc., may be brought to the college.
- All students should be particular about the cleanliness of the college. They should use the baskets and bins specially provided for this purpose
- Habitual idleness, late coming, willful disobedience, or misconduct, whether individually or collectively, will be seriously dealt with. Students suffering from diseases declared infectious by a Registered Medical Practitioner, which require quarantine or segregation, will not be permitted to attend the college without being certified as cured by the same.
- Any student who is persistently insubordinate or repeatedly or willfully mischievous, or who is guilty of malpractice in connection with examinations, or has committed an act of serious indiscipline and/or misbehavior, or who, in the opinion of the principal, has an unwholesome influence on his fellow students, may be suspended from the college for a specified period or even expelled from the college.

Mobile Phone Policy

Bringing mobile phones within the campus is strictly prohibited as per university norms. If any student is found with a mobile phone, the device shall be forfeited, and strict action shall be taken against the student.

Dress Code

Students are required to adhere to a formal dress code. As per the Bar Council of India Rules, the dress code for legal professionals in pupillage is as follows:

For all students: White or black trousers, white shirt, black tie, black coat, black shoes, and black socks. If students encounter difficulty in obtaining the entire formal dress for any reason, they must wear a white trouser, full-sleeve shirt (to be tucked in), and covered shoes.

Optional for girl students: Black printed saree with a white full-sleeve blouse and covered black shoes, or Lawyer's Suit with black covered shoes. The organization or advocate under whom the internee is placed should follow a suitable dress code.

Ragging is Prohibited

The Government of Maharashtra has classified ragging as a cognizable offense. Any individual reported to be involved in any form of ragging will face severe consequences. Therefore, students are strongly advised to refrain from indulging in any form of ragging.



Attendance and Grant of Terms

1. Ordinances 0.119 and 0.120:

- Ordinance 0.119, explained in circular no. UG/235/98 dated 03/07/1998, stipulates that to be granted terms, students must maintain a minimum attendance of 75% in theory, practical, and tutorials (if applicable), separately. This attendance requirement is based on the total number of lectures, practical sessions, and tutorials conducted during the term.

2. Ordinance 0.125:

- According to Ordinance 0.125, undergraduate students must fulfill the prescribed course of study to the satisfaction of the Principal or Head of the institution to retain their term at the college or recognized institution. The completion of the course of study determines the eligibility of students to continue in their respective class or category.

3. Procedure for Absence due to Illness or Other Reasons:

- Students who fail to meet the minimum attendance requirement due to bona fide illness or any other valid reason recognized by the principal must submit a written application for leave of absence. This application should be submitted prior to or within two days from the commencement of the leave period.

- All applications for leave, along with any medical certificates if applicable, should be addressed to the principal directly and not to any individual teacher.

General Rules Pertaining to Attendance

Leave of Absence for Participation in Extracurricular Activities:

1. Students seeking leave of absence from lectures, practicals, or tutorials to participate in sports, cultural events, or any other activities representing the college must submit their application. This application should be countersigned by the respective teacher.

Decision-making on Grant of Terms:

2. All decisions regarding the grant of terms will be made by an Attendance Committee established by the college for this purpose. This committee will be duly constituted and authorized to assess attendance records and make decisions accordingly.

Procedure For Investigation in Case of Malpractices

- The candidate may be served a show cause notice and made aware of the charges/allegations reported against him to prepare his/her defense at the time of his/her appearance before the Unfair Means Inquiry Committee and informing his/her thereby, of the proposed action to be taken in his/her case with a request to replay to the show cause notice as to why the action proposed under it should not be taken against him/her.
- The replay received by the Committee from the candidate when he/she appears before it will be considered by the Committee, and the final recommendation in the matter will be made.
- The punishment finally awarded can be equal to or less than what is mentioned in the show cause notice, but not more than what is mentioned therein.
- The College Unfair Means Inquiry Committee is a recommendatory body. The principal has to exercise his/her power.
- The broad categories of unfair means resorted to by students during University/College/Institution examinations, along with the corresponding quantum of punishment for each category, are outlined below:

LIBRARY

General Information: -

The college boasts a well-equipped library with a collection of more than 5000+ books. The Library and Reading Halls remain open from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. to cater to the needs of the students. In addition to books, the library holds important Periodicals such as All India Reporter, Indian Bar Review, All Maharashtra Law Reporter, Supreme Court Cases, and Law Teller.

For research purposes, the library provides access to legal databases like AIR Infotech and Digi Law for Judgement Search/Bare Acts. A Library Committee has been formed to ensure the smooth conduct of library management, including budgeting and the purchase of books.

To encourage a culture of reading and academic excellence, the college has instituted the 'Best Reader Award' for students who demonstrate exceptional commitment to reading and research.

Library Rules & Regulations

1. The entry will be restricted to Identity card holders only
2. B.A., LL.B. (5 Yrs.) & LL.B. (3 Yrs.) Students can Issue : 1 Book for 7 days
3. LL.M. Students can Issue : 2 Books for 14 days each
4. Library Timings:
Reading Room: 8:00 am to 6:00 pm (Monday-Saturday)
Issue/Return: 9:00 am to 5:00 pm (Monday-Saturday)
5. Bags/Hand bags should be kept in Baggage Area in the library.
6. Mobile phones are strictly prohibited in the library.
7. Books will be issued subject to availability.
8. If the book due date falls on a holiday for the library, the next working day will be taken as the due date.
9. In case of late return of books, student will have to pay a fine of Rs. 2/- per day.
10. The borrower will be responsible for any loss or non-return of any books issued against his/her identity card.
11. Reference books, Newspaper and Magazines/Journals should not be taken out of the library.
12. Absence from the institute will not be allowed as an excuse for the delay in the return of books.



13. Any kind of damage of library materials (marking, underlying and clipping of books) is absolutely forbidden. Readers shall be held responsible for any damage done to the book belonging to the library and shall be required to replace it or pay the value of the book.
14. Under special circumstances, the librarian may refuse the issue of books or recall the books already issued from any member without assigning any reason thereof.
15. Ex-students or External Members will be permitted to use library on payment of a library fee of Rs. 1000/- and Deposit 500/- annually. They will be allowed to use all library facilities. (Loan Period: 2 Books / 7 days each).
16. The Library is to be used for the purpose of academic study and research and for the consultation of subject and other related material. Everyone on in the library shall respect the rights of other users.
17. Anyone using the library shall identify himself on request from any member of the library staff. Silence must be strictly observed both by the users and the library staff in the reading and reference zones of the library.
18. Users are not permitted to consume food in the library and reading room.
19. No one shall reserve a working place in the library by leaving library material or personal property on a reading table.
20. Every user must return the books/journals in its original place after its use has been served.
21. The library is not responsible for any loss of any personal property brought into the library.



SCHOLARSHIPS / FREESHIP

Maharashtra State Scholarships

The Government of Maharashtra offers a wide range of scholarships to students who are domiciled in the state. These scholarships are designed to provide financial assistance to meritorious as well as economically disadvantaged students from diverse social backgrounds. They play a significant role in promoting inclusive education by ensuring equal opportunities for students belonging to Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), VJNT, Other Backward Classes (OBC), Economically Backward Classes (EBC), and other disadvantaged groups.

Application Process

Students are required to apply for these scholarships through the respective government departments by following the prescribed procedure. The application process is generally conducted online through the official portal, although specific guidelines may vary depending on the scheme. It is important for applicants to carefully follow the instructions and complete the application within the stipulated deadline to successfully avail the benefits of these scholarships.



Group Insurance Scheme

We insure all our students with an appropriate Insurance Company under a group insurance scheme, which covers the risks of accidents on college premises.

Legal Aid Centre

The college has established a Legal Aid Centre since the commencement of its operations. Free legal advice is provided to all needy individuals who visit the college seeking legal assistance. Additionally, legal aid camps are organized for the benefit of residents in the locality. The college also runs a legal aid clinic every Saturday. Moreover, students have the opportunity to become para-legal volunteers and represent the college at District Legal Aid Services.

Career Options

Career Options for Law Graduates

Advocate - Litigation (Court Cases)

Practicing as a lawyer in various courts is a primary option for law graduates. Lawyers can showcase their skills and assist litigants in courts, tribunals, and quasi-judicial authorities. With experience and expertise, lawyers can specialize in various areas of practice.

Advocate - non-litigation

Instead of practicing in courts, an advocate can engage in chamber practice, which includes drafting agreements, title reports for financial institutions, and other legal documents.

Government Pleader/Public Prosecutor

Law graduates who have practiced as advocates for seven years are eligible to be appointed as Government Pleaders or Public Prosecutors in District Courts and High Courts. This position is for a limited term as prescribed by the government in the appointment order. Additionally, law graduates who have practiced for five years can appear for the written examination for Assistant Public Prosecutor - Group A posts, conducted by the MPSC. The appointed person can work in this position until retirement.

Judicial Service

The Civil Judge Junior Division & Judicial Magistrate First Class Examination is conducted by the MPSC. Law graduates who have passed their exams without ATKT (in the first attempt) or have practiced as advocates for three years are eligible to appear for the written examination. Appointments are subject to the results of the examination and interview.



Teaching Profession

The establishment of numerous law colleges and a shortage of qualified law graduates has created many job opportunities in the teaching profession. Law graduates who have passed the LL.M. examination with a minimum of 55% marks and have qualified the NET/SET examination are eligible to be appointed as Assistant Professors in Law (full-time faculty). Due to the shortage of qualified professors, law graduates with a minimum of 55% marks in their LL.M. examination can be appointed as Assistant Professors on a contractual basis. Practicing advocates with the same qualifications can work as part-time lecturers in law.

Service as Law Officer

Practicing lawyers can secure positions as Law Managers in various banking institutions. Additionally, there are numerous employment opportunities in municipal councils, municipal corporations, and government bodies such as CIDCO, MSRTC, and MSEDCL as Legal Advisors or Law Officers.

Civil Services

The Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducts a nationwide examination for recruitment to various civil service positions in the government, such as Indian Administrative Services (IAS), Indian Foreign Services (IFS), and Indian Police Services (IPS). Similarly, the Maharashtra Public Service Commission (MPSC) conducts state-wide examinations for recruitment to various civil service positions in the state. The legal knowledge and experience gained by law graduates make it relatively easier to prepare for these examinations.
